The Asian Pacific Residential Treatment Program was established in 1986 to provide services for mentally ill Asian Pacific Islanders who were homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless. The program is composed of case management, mental health services, on-site day rehabilitation, and medication support. Services also include independent living skills training, vocational evaluation and adjustment, individual sessions, monthly outings, and annual celebrations such as Thanksgiving dinner. Through a multi-disciplinary and multi-cultural approach, the ultimate goal is to assist clients to make the transition to independent living and to improve the client's life.

The Pacific Asian Alcohol and Drug Program (PAADP) was organized in 1978 (originally as the Pacific Asian Alcohol Program) to provide alcohol and drug prevention services, outpatient services such as counseling and drug testing, and day treatment services. The goals of the program include creating awareness among community members and leaders about the effects of drug and alcohol abuse, providing counseling and outreach to members of the Pacific Asian community, especially new immigrants and refugees, and providing technical assistance to community agencies seeking to provide substance abuse services to Pacific Asians.
