The Older Adults Program is composed of two central projects: ICM/Care and Resource Management for Seniors (CARES) and REACH 2010/Health Access for Pacific Asian Seniors (HAPAS). The goal of the CARES project is to enable functionally-impaired adults, older adults and family caregivers to improve and maintain their functioning and to live in the least restrictive setting possible. The HAPAS project seeks to eliminate racial and ethnic disparities in health for older adults in Los Angeles and Orange Counties. The services target low-income and limited-English proficient South Asian (Bengali, Hindi, Punjabi, Urdu), Southeast Asian (Cambodian, Laotian, Thai, Vietnamese), Pacific Islander (Chamorro/Guamanian, Samoan, Tongan) and Filipino older adults and family caregivers. Services include outreach, community health education, and care management.

Court Referral Service (CRS) began in 1997 and is funded by the Los Angeles County Department of Probation to provide a fee-based volunteer placement service for the probation and court system. Volunteers are referred due to misdemeanor infractions or as a condition of probation, and the project emphasizes the probationer's responsibility to the community. CRS places volunteers into various community-based agencies, including community improvement projects such as graffiti clean-ups. In addition, CRS provides vocational assessment and training services to youth.
